DEVELOPMENT OF SUCCESSFUL PATTERNS IN WOMENS TENNIS

Women's tennis is at the core of player development. The women's game is characterised by specific and identifiable patterns of play. These defined patterns need to be developed, practised and mastered by women players in order to reach the top. Background to the presentation:

It is evident that women's tennis has gone through a depth revolution during the last years. This revolution has caused the survival of women's tennis which was in danger due to the lack of players able to attract spectators to tournaments and consequently unable to generate interest in previous years.

This revolution was originated with the appearance in the circuit of players such as the Williams sisters, the Belgian players Henin and Clijsters, Mauresmo and the new generation of Eastern European players such as Kuznetsova, Zvonareva, Dementieva, Sharapova, Bovina, Safina, Myskina, Hantuchova, etc.

These players have shown that women's tennis can be more spectacular and this has generated interest in the media, so there are more players that are well known by the fans and that new sponsors are investing in the women's circuit.
